### **YEAR 3**

This half term the children have been immersed in Victorian times with a focus on Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*. In English the children have written descriptive pieces about Victorian London at Christmas time and then a contrasting piece about Christmas time in London today. They have also written super simile poems about Ebenezer Scrooge. After several weeks of practice and hard work, the children showcased their many talents performing *A Christmas Carol* to rave reviews this week. Well done to everyone (narrators, actors, dancers, singers) for a series of wonderful performances that really put us all in the festive spirit. The year group finally reached its dramatic conclusion this week and it was given a strong recommendation by all the children. Everyone in Y5 also worked extremely hard to produce a huge range of different items to sell at the Christmas fayre. Anyone who visited the Y5 stall will agree that the quality and quantity of items on show was incredible!

## **YEAR 6**

The Year 6 World War 2 theme came to an end with a superb V.E. tea party. Firstly, the children had to learn how to make scones so they could provide our 120 guests with a typical WW2 treat. In computing pupils used spreadsheets to work out costings and profits of the tea party. On the day of the tea party, the children took on a variety of different roles such as waiters and waitresses, cashiers, scone stall assistants, welcomers and pot washers. We then entertained our guests with jive dancing and singing. (See more details below.) Writing has been linked closely to the wartime theme with children working hard to write and edit imaginative stories set during the war.

The Twinkl arctic experience day was a real success, especially the virtual reality headsets, which really brought the arctic to life. Following on from this, the children researched different biomes including the tropical rainforest, the Savannah desert and a temperate forest. Children have also been delving deeply into fractions and percentages in maths and hugely enjoyed making tiffin for the Christmas fayre.

Some of our Year 6 pupils performed at the Jack Goodison Christmas concert at the Lomas Hall. They sang a mixture of traditional, new and local carols. Their singing and playing was outstanding.

The Year 6 netball team won the league at Low Edges Primary School. The team has qualified for the South Yorkshire finals sometime in the New Year, an achievement to be really proud of!

## **INTEGRATED RESOURCE**

What a busy, fun-filled half term! The children have continued to access weekly interventions about thoughts and feelings and have been applying newly-acquired skills in different contexts. Social skills work this half term has focused on turn-taking and supportive language during games.

In weekly music sessions children have been learning how to read a music score and have developed their skills in the playing of xylophones whilst also playing and experimenting with tuned and un-tuned instruments. The pupils have been practising their songs to perform for an end of term assembly. Children in Year 5 from the Resource really enjoyed the opportunities and challenges that the Thornbridge residential trip offered. Some children were successful in staying all week while other children felt more comfortable accessing this on a daily basis. Overall this was a tremendous achievement for many of our children.

This half term in maths children have practised addition and subtraction and have been solving- problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems. In English our book study has been Billy and the Minpins. Children have been involved in a wealth of multi-sensory learning opportunities involving the

creation of a Minpin house using lollipop sticks and some fantastic 3D collages of the Forest of Sin using natural resources from around the school. This year's Grotto was another tremendous success as Santa's elves and Santa himself visited Nook Lane in a magical 'White Christmas'- themed Grotto. Children and the IR team worked very hard to make sure the experience was enjoyed by all.
